Exhibition Design • (In)Visible Energies • Mies van der Rohe Pavillion BCN For UCL MEng and HereEast • 2024

Exhibition design to support an installation engineered by UCL Here East research team. The project was set up in order to experiment with a new way of collective work and shared design integrity. I was entrusted with the design and layout of the exhibition inside the pavilion and communicating this is the pavillion team, despite being a junior member of the team.

I then fabricated all the elements inside the pavillion. Everything is threaded - each of the different structures requiring no nuts, held together and given rigidity by the display items themselves. This idea references the manufacturing and structural system of the exhibited installation and stems from the importance of connection details in the exhibited sculptures.


The other main design driver was the site itself, particularly concerned with the interaction between the stands and the gridded travertine. I wanted to use the gaps between and the void below to give the spindly structures stability, hiding electrics and defining location.












Projects in detail - Lunarcy Settlement 2025 Izzy Watson









Lunarcy Settlement • Speculative Building/Master Plan

Thesis Project • 2023


Set in a valley in the Black Forest, this farming commune shares a deep routed obsession with the moon and the continuous geometry of circles, fundamental to mechanistic pathways. From programme, styalising and developing a philosophy of the protagonists to how I presented the project I saw this was an exercise in world building.


Premised on the relationship between man and mechanism, the building is a collection of anthropomorphic machines which are maintained, expanded and worshipped by its inhabitants, a mix of 'romantic' minds (concerned with aesthetic and overall form) and 'classical' minds (concerned with the function of individual parts composing the whole). Towering mirror machines target circular moonlight towards the site, controlling work and play on the farm.

The project culminated a full master plan (inc. technical drawings, final video (right) which explores the design in fragments through a series of vignettes and a series physical models at different scales. For each presentation throughout the project I dressed as one of my imagined protagonists and employed lighting/staging techniques in the space to explore the design's integral relationship to light.





Furniture & Functional Objects • Curated exhibition and events Self initiated • June 2024

Curated and produced group show 'Furniture & Functional Objects', which opened June 2024. Subsequent to this exhibitions success I was offered the space on a more permanent curatorial basis, this ongoing project became known as Castle.

I produced all the graphics and copy, organised events surrounding the show and entirely revamped a shop into a functioning gallery space. 13 artists where invited to exhibit following an open call. All the signage was fixed with magnets & including hand crafted steel card holders.






















The Comic House Workshop Programme • Education Development and Design

With Urban Learners CIC • September 2025

The workshops were a whistle stop tour through Post-Modernist approach to design, theories and architectural history for 6th form students from local state schools. I lead the design and production of the days format, drawing and collage activities, presentation and tours, delivered the 4 pilot workshops over a week and then produced a full evaluative report. It is part of a wider outreach programme we have been asked to continue developing with the Cosmic House going forward after it's noted success fullfilling the clients aims and posative reported impact on the engaged schools.

The programme focused on the importance of building and translating concepts from a brief into a creative output, interpretting concepts itteratively and abstractly and then how to communicate their design process effectively - important cross-curricular skills I believe are under developed in the current school curriculum and an approach Charles Jenck's expressed throughout his work, exemplified in this experimental house he built.

Students made collages of an interior space using textures from around the house and references from The Jenck's Foundation archives and guided by a series of worksheets encouraging a layered design approach.














Blackfriars Parastation • Speculative Building / Masterplan

Ongoing investigative project • 2021 - Present


Located beside Blackfriars Station on the Southbank, the building provides a sprawling free public space, art studios, practice spaces, waiting rooms and a docking station. Large symbiotic mechanisms attach observatory modules to trains as they arrive at Blackfriars Station and flaneur passengers are taken on a derive through the city. A diverse range of interlinked conditions within the scheme - a labyrinth of liminal and activatable spaces - catering to preferences for exhibitionism and voyeurism, pause and exploration.

All collage material is taken from situationist magazines, video games that encourage world mapping, anarchist comics and newspaper games from my own travels around London.



WARP • Installation/Stage Design for festival

Self initiated • 2023-onwards

Continuing with my interest in manipulating metal to create built 'textiles' that interact with light. Warp is an activatable structure where by lights move inducing variations in lighting patterns. It would be introduced and demonstrated to the festival goers by a live improvised dance and musical ensemble, able to adjust the lighting rhythmically as they perform. The system can be scaled, but began as a wall structure with bespoke kinetic mechanisms.

The design exists in various iterations, at different scales and typographies. I continue to develop it, particularly around it's production methods and pitch it to interested festivals. I have other projects of different scales, which were similarly self initiated, intended for festivals and activatable spaces.






On Paper • Tellus Triannual • September 2024







Technical detail of 'Moon Hall' 🔻

Technical Drawing/Sketching

While I mainly use Rhino and illustrator for technical drawings, I have a strong foundation in hand drawing and visual hierachy. Having delved through countless detail magazines in order to technically realise some of my more technically ambicious designs at undergrad, I have gained a wide ranging grasp of a variety of construction techniques, giving me a foundation of understanding in more classic structural systems in drawings for clients.

I'm also a good sketcher (perspective, structural details, projections etc) and

can efficiently talk-draw through ideas with collaborators and clients.

Physical Modelling

I have a strong foundation in architectural model making. At Boano Prismontas I produced both working and presentation models. My attention to detail, steady hand and understanding of spatial relationships result in high-quality, accurate representations that support design communication effectively. I'm confident in a workshop and in desk top model construction, skilled with tools and machine maintenance.

My portfolio includes a video of my final building, A Classic Romantic, showcasing intricate construction, innovative materials, and thoughtful documentation—using light, scale, and narrative to convey spatial design.


Visualisation / CAD





Information Communication / Graphics

Diagrams and deck formatting are key responsibilities I handle for the team at Urban Learners, predominantly using indesign. Each document I create requires a tailored approach, whether it's a competition entry, funding proposal, family guide, instructions for students or guidelines for teachers, ensuring the right tone and graphical clarity for it's intended audience. I have also recently reiterated our logos and brand identity.

I have also developed on my diagramatic skills and ability in presenting a design narrative through curration of multiple exhibitions and throughout my design education

Verbal and Written Communication

I have strong research, communication and copy writing skills, as evidenced by various successful funding applications, the full educational programme I produced for the Cosmic House and a strong First grade on my dissertation thesis.

At Urban Learners have built strong working relationships with collegues, partners, clients, teachers and other professionals, adapting language for different demographics. I also collaborate with students to translate, develop and realise their designs in co-design projects. Organisation and Time Management
